Monty Henson, sometimes known as **Hawkeye Henson** (born October 1953), is a three-time Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association world champion saddle bronc rider.

He was born in Farmersville near Dallas, Texas. During his rodeo career he won 3 world titles in 1975, 1976, and again in 1982. He won the average at the NFR 4 times. He won or placed at almost every major rodeo in the country. He has been around the world, Rodeoing as well going to rodeos in Europe and Japan.

Known for his flying dismount and infamous eagle feather in his hat, Hawkeye's style and ability have been compared to those

of the legendary **Casey Tibbs**. He qualified for the National Finals Rodeo 14 times. Henson was quoted as saying, "I'm a cowboy. That's the best thing anybody could say about me. If I could have that on my tombstone – Here lies Hawkeye, a cowboy – then I can die a happy man."

In 1994, he was inducted in the Prorodeo Hall of Fame. In 2003 he was inducted into the Texas Rodeo Cowboy Hall of Fame in Belton, the seat of Bell County in central Texas.

In 2002, Hawkeye was inducted into the Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame located in the Fort Worth Stockyards in Fort Worth. Inducted for his rodeo accomplishments, the museum features many of his personal items used during his illustrious rodeo career. These items can only be seen at the museum.

He has appeared in numerous television programs and films. In 2004, he was cast as Hawkeye in four episodes of the HBO series *Deadwood* alongside lan McShane, Timothy Olyphant, and Molly Parker. He is also a Country music entertainer. He also still promotes several rodeos across the country.

Honorary Pioneer Family The Olsen Family legacy

The Olsen Family Pioneer Legacy began in the late 1940's. John Olsen, from Littleton, Colorado, met Ann Fornara from Prescott, Arizona while both were attending Colorado State University. They were married in 1949, and after living for 2 years in Colorado, moved to Arizona.

John and Ann then partnered with the Fornara and Savoini families and started the JCJ Ranch in Big Chino. The JCJ Ranch started with bare land, and was transformed into a home with 1000 acres of irrigated farm land. John Olsen was mostly responsible for the farming, while the Fornaras and Savoinis took care of the cattle operation.

John and Ann had four children, Kathy, Mike, Dan and Marie. In the late 1950's, the family moved to Prescott so the children could attend school. John learned to fly, bought an airplane, and flew to the ranch almost every day for 25 years. In 1972 the JCJ Ranch was sold and John then managed the Kieckhefer Foundation Farms Ranch in Big Chino for 10 years.

While raising a family and working the farm, John became very active in many organizations, such as Yavapai Cattle Growers and Soil Conservation Districts. For 14 years John served as a Yavapai County Supervisor.

In 1979, John and Ann along with Mike and Sherrill bought Chino Valley Grain Co. and started what is now Olsen's for Healthy Animals.

Olsen's grew from one store in Chino Valley, to a second in Prescott run by Steve and Kathy Sischka in 1980, and a third store in Dewey ran by Dan and Barb Olsen in 1982. Olsen's now has five locations with the addition of stores in Flagstaff and the Verde Valley in the late 1990's.

The Olsen family members have always followed John's example and have all become active members of our communities, supporting many organizations such as Prescott Frontier Days Rodeo. The Olsen family is proud to call Prescott and surrounding communities home.
